HOW BOBATH CAN HELP YOU

Adults: You or someone else on your behalf should fill out the referral form from our website: www.bobathscotland.org.uk and then mail it to us at Bobath Scotland, 10 High Craighall Road, Glasgow, G4 9UD. You can also email it to the address in the form. Once we've received this application, we will send you a questionnaire to fill out. The information in the questionnaire will help us understand your condition so that we can offer you the most useful therapy options. Our Family Coordinator will then contact you to set up an assessment appointment with a physiotherapist and others if required. At the assessment appointment the physiotherapist will discuss the therapy options with you and your carer if desired and will communicate your choice to the Family Coordinator who will then try to schedule sessions accordingly. The costs of adult therapy are not covered by the NHS.

Children: Parents/carers can initiate referral to Bobath Scotland by approaching their local NHS therapy team or consultant paediatrician to refer to us. We work in close collaboration with local therapists and will contact them after we've received a referral, to obtain relevant information that will enable us to provide the best service. 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
